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1. To be treated with courtesy, dignity and respect.
 2. To be listened to without interruption.
 3. To receive clear answers that I understand.
 4. To participate in decisions that involve my physical and mental health care.
 5. To be included in options about my diagnosis and treatment.
 6. To be informed about risks, drug interactions, prognosis and expected outcomes of any medical treatments.
 7. I have the right to accept or refuse any treatment or medication.
 8. To have the results of any medical tests explained to me in detail.
 9. To have access to all my medical records any time I ask for them.
 10. To have support for any alternative treatments I choose that I believe may benefit me and respect for any positive results they may have on me.




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
